A searchable database of cemetery inscriptions from 6,000+ cemeteries in Australia, mostly regional NSW, QLD and SA with some from other states. Digital images of the headstone accompany most of the inscriptions. These are free to download and use without restriction.

You can search online at the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website for all 1.7 million deaths of the Commonwealth forces who died in the two world wars and subsequent conflicts so that graves or names on memorials can be located.

The Ryerson Index is an index to death notices appearing in current Australian newspapers. It also includes some funeral notices, probate notices and obituaries.

The index itself cannot by definition be considered a primary source of data, but is purely a research aid to direct the researcher to the original source of a notice.
